

## 14th Degree—The Burning Bush

In accordance with the story as told in the Bible, Moses returned to Egypt and led his people out of bondage toward the promised land. They wandered in the Sinai Peninsula for 40 years. During this period, Moses found himself at the foot of a mountain. Scholars dispute where this mountain was. However, since the fourth century AD when Coptic Christians founded a small church there, Christians (and later Muslims) have revered what is now called Mount Sinai.

According to scripture, Moses spoke directly to God through a burning bush that was not consumed by the fire. On God's instructions Moses went up on the mountain and there received, directly from the hand of God, the Ten Commandments. Moses listened to God call his name from the burning bush, and he listened as God told him that he was going to Egypt. Then Moses asked a very reasonable question, "Who am I?" In other words, Moses was saying to God, "Forty years ago I tried to rescue my people, but look what happened. My people didn't want my help. Pharaoh tried to kill me, and I fled to the desert. I've been taking care of sheep for the past 40 years. Who am I? I've already tried this, and it didn't work." God answered Moses' "Who am I?" question with an "I AM" answer! Moses asked a reasonable question, but it was the wrong question. It wasn't WHO Moses was, but who GOD was that mattered! God's answer firmly settled the matter. One of God's names is I AM. I AM may seem like an unusual name to us, but it is the most powerful name of all! I AM means that God is the only true God. There were many false gods in Egypt. I AM is the God who has always been and always will be (Revelation 1:8). There is no other god besides I AM. When God revealed Himself as the God of Abraham. Isaac, and Jacob, He was revealing Himself as a covenant-making God. A covenant is an unbreakable promise between God and people. When God made a covenant with Abraham, what did He say?

The Lord had said to Abram, "Leave your country and your people. Leave your father's family. Go to the land I will show you. I will make you into a great nation. I will bless you. I will make your name great. You will be a blessing to others. I will bless those who bless you. I will put a curse on anyone who calls down a curse on you. All nations on earth will be blessed because of you." - Genesis 12:1-4

The covenant-making God was talking to Moses! When God makes a covenant, he keeps his word. God ALWAYS keeps His promises! And Moses is about to hear some WONDERFUL NEWS!

The Lord said, "I have seen my people suffer in Egypt. I have heard them cry out because of their slave drivers. I am con cerned about their suffering. So I have come down to save them from the Egyptians. I will bring them up out of that land. I will bring them into a good land. It has a lot of room. It is a land that has plenty of milk and honey." - Exodus 3: 7-8

This land that God promised to Abraham long ago was now going to become the new home for all the Hebrew people who were suffering as slaves in Egypt. God is not only a Covenant making God, but He is also compassionate. The Bible says that God heard the Israelites cry out and that He was concerned about their suffering. That's what compassion is: to be concerned about someone else.

# The Hero Among Us

November 5, 2011 New Castle, DE. Brother and Retired Lt. Colonel Tenney H. Wheatley, Jr. was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross on this date in an impressive ceremony at the Delaware Air National Guard 166th Airlift Wing headquarters New Castle Airport. It was just short of 41 years since he took the action that earned him that award and he thought that if he ever received the award, it would be posthumously. Fortunately, it finally happened.

What is it? The Distinguished Flying Cross is one of the highest awards an aviator can receive. This medal is awarded to any officer or enlisted person of the Armed Forces of the United States who shall have distinguished her/himself in actual combat in support of operations by heroism or extraordinary achievement while participating in an aerial flight, subsequent to November 11, 1918.



Why did he earn it? As a member of the Guard, he and nine other crew members of a C-97 were on a flight over the North Atlantic when the transport began a nosedive. The actual problem can only be described in technical terms, but the problem did not have an easy solution. Brother Wheatley's quick thinking brought the plane nearly level and slowed the descent so that they were able to make an emergency landing in Canada. Thus, he saved the crew of ten plus two passengers that were picked up at Dover Air Force Base.



Here is what the ill-fated plane looked like, although it is hard to tell where the problem lies. An amateur photographer captured a picture of the plane in Canada and recalled that the cowl flaps were in the wrong position and the crew was working on them.

Why did it take so long? Three members of the crew were awarded DFC medals about a year after the event. It looks like a clerical error mistakenly identified Brother Wheatley. So, it came down to another crew member who decided to correct the wrong. Fortunately, he fought through the "red tape" and as a result, Brother Wheatley finally received his due reward.

**Masonic affiliation**. Brother Wheatley is a 32° member of Delaware Consistory and Treasurer of the Delaware Council of Deliberation. He is a member of Granite-Corinthian Lodge No. 34, A.F. & A.M. and holds membership in several other Masonic bodies.
