21st	The time and place represented in the Degree of Patriarch Noachite is late 12th Century Germany, in Westphalia, near the Imperial Free City of Dortmund. The Grand Chapter of Patriarch Noachites is representative of a secret society or tribunal known as the Vehme (FEM-e). This tribunal was a necessary institution in the Middle Ages, as crime was rampant and could not be kept under control by the governments of Central Europe. Knights and nobles were leagued together in the Grand Chapter in order to punish crime, reward virtue, protect the innocent, and provide aid and assistance to the needy and afflicted, regardless of wealth or social standing. This Degree portrays a meeting of the Grand Chapter of Patriarch Noachites, and makes clear that Freemasonry is not a shield for evil doing and that the pillar of Justice is one of the chief supports of our fraternity. 

For those who have already started their Pathfinder journey, or for those interested in beginning their path, there are 6 Waypoints that help one progress through the program with numerous Mile Markers under each Waypoint that will guide you in learning all about our Rite in general and your Valley in particular.

The Six Waypoints are: Organization, Self-improvement, Valley Life, Enrichment Programs, Service and Philosophy, and Choice. Under Organization, there are 18 Mile Markers of which you need to complete 6. Under Self-Improvement, there are 22 Mile Markers of which you must complete 6. Under Valley Life, there are 24 Mile Markers of which you must complete 6. Under Enrichment Programs, there are 14 Mile Markers of which you must complete 6. Under Service and Philosophy, there are 27 Mile Markers of which you must complete 6. Under Choice, you may go back and complete any two additional Mile Markers from any of the Waypoints.


There are Field Guides and Workbooks you can use to keep track of your progress, BUT there is also a Pathfinder Digital portal on-line where you can track your progress electronically.

# Dr. John Warren's Medical Trunk

This leather and wood trunk decorated with brass studs is thought to have belonged to Dr. John Warren (1753-1815) of Massachusetts. Its side handles and manageable size (11-7/8" x 13-1/2" x 24-1/2") made it both portable and practical. Through the service of its dynamic owner, this trunk may have seen military action during the American Revolutionary War.

Born in Roxbury, Massachusetts, Dr. John Warren was the younger brother of Dr. Joseph

Warren, whose death at the Battle of Bunker Hill made him a martyr to the Patriot cause. John Warren studied medicine at Harvard, graduating in 1771. He became a surgeon with a militia commanded by Colonel Timothy Pickering (1745-1829) in 1772 and in that capacity, responded to the Lexington Alarm in April 1775.

In 1775, Warren was practicing medicine in Salem, Massachusetts. He traveled with his unit to the various battles in which he was involved. Like many Massachusetts militia members who were called out for the Lexington Alarm, Warren remained in the Boston area into the month of May. Warren likely brought his own medical supplies with him when he traveled. He owned two amputation kits. Based on the dimensions of these amputation kits, both items could have been carried inside this trunk.

By June 1775, Warren had returned home to Salem and received news of the start of the Battle of Bunker Hill. He hurried to Cambridge in the early hours of the following morning to treat wounded soldiers. At the same time, Warren fretted about his brother Joseph who had fought in the battle. At one point, Warren left the medical area in Cambridge and went to Bunker Hill to find his brother, asking any and all soldiers he encountered about Joseph's whereabouts. One of these was a British sentry, and Warren received a bayonet wound to his side in response to his inquiry. Unfortunately, Joseph "fell on the field," as John later wrote in his diary.

His fervor for the Patriot cause and his brother's death motivated Warren. According to Sibley's Harvard Graduates, "He enjoyed helping repulse the raid at Lechmere Point, and, case in hand [emphasis mine], took his post on Cobble Hill at night hoping for another Bunker Hill." The "case" mentioned was likely a medical case, possibly this trunk. Cobble Hill was a colonist-fortified hill in Charlestown with an excellent view of Boston Harbor. Warren may have carried his medical supplies in this trunk during the early days of the Revolutionary War when the action was focused in Massachusetts It is also possible that Warren brought this trunk with him when the action moved away from Massachusetts. The nascent Continental Army struggled to provide uniforms, firearms, and other supplies to its soldiers. Warren's medical tools and supplies would have been highly valued and were likely brought with him when he left for New York in May 1776, after the British evacuated from Boston.

Warren later served as Surgeon General of army hospitals in Long Island, New York and Bethlehem, New Jersey in 1776. In the latter location, he—and possibly this trunk—saw action at the Battles of Trenton and Princeton. Warren also participated in the 1778 Rhode Island campaign, perhaps due to his marriage the previous year to Abigail Collins (1760-1832), daughter of Rhode Island Governor John Collins (1717-1795).

Dr. John Warren was a knowledgeable and dedicated surgeon, who put his medical skills to use in service of the American cause. This trunk, both substantial enough to hold needed medical supplies and portable enough to carry into battle, is an apt symbol of his service. Warren's trunk will be on view at the Scottish Rite Masonic Museum & Library beginning in April 2025, part of the Scottish Rite Masonic Museum & Library's newest gallery exhibition, "Protest & Promise: The American Revolution in Lexington."

# LEON M. ABBOTT SCHOLARSHIPS

"Helping those who most need it strive for greater heights"

The Supreme Council is pleased to announce an expansion of the eligibility criteria for Abbott Scholarship awards. Named for Leon M. Abbott, Sovereign Grand Commander from 1921 to 1932, the Abbott Scholarship Program provides financial support for the continuing undergraduate and graduate education of Scottish Rite Masons, young men and women from Scottish Rite families, and Masonic related youth groups.



Eligibility: Those meeting any of the following criteria are eligible to apply for the Abbott Scholarship program:

- 🏶 A Scottish Rite Mason of the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction who is in good standing.
- A student directly related (bloodline or by legal means) to a current or deceased Scottish Rite Mason in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.
- A member of a Masonic sponsored youth group located in the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction.

In addition, the applicant must be either:

- A high school senior, currently accepted at an accredited trade school or college or university who has attained a minimum grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale OR
- An undergraduate or graduate student currently enrolled at an accredited trade school or college or university.

To apply, applicants should print the form, complete it, and mail it to the appropriate Valley secretary (Jack McDuff – VOLD or Steve Tucker VOW) received by April 15, 2025. Applicants should submit their application to the Valley of the sponsor of the applicant.

With the changing of seasons, I have been doing some reflection and contemplation. My mind travelled to the three Ruffians.

Being of the Canadian Work, I found it remarkable to sit on the side as well as participate in the York Rite work of our fellow Brethren as they initiated, raised and passed new brothers to the fraternity. W.L. Wilmhurst in his "The Meaning of Masonry" states the central to the initiatory process of Freemasonry is the allegory of the Hiramic Legend. Today I would like to touch on what I believe is the meaning that we should take from the Hiramic Legend.

We can spend hours searching the internet, perusing the vast volumes of history, scouring through our favourite version of the bible, but it is within the second part of the Master Mason Degree where we find the story of Hiram Abiff; suggesting that it is merely an allegory, a parable worth contemplation. It is here were we are again told of the age-old story of the struggle between good and evil. My Chips off the Ashlar today is to expound upon how I believe the main characters of the second section of the Master Mason Degree are used as symbols, their meaning, and how they are used to communicate the lesson that they are intended to impart.

Solomon King of Israel, Hiram King of Tyre, and Hiram Abiff represent as suggested in the degrees, wisdom, honesty, and perseverance. Jointly they characterize all that is good and

pure in the world. They exemplify brotherly love, relief, and truth. They symbolise perfection that each of us has obligate to labour daily towards. The three principle fellowcrafts represent the labor that each of us must perform, the reflection that we must employ and the care for all of whom we encounter during our daily labour so that in turn we become a better person each day and if we are fortunate, assist others in their daily advancement.

Each of the characters in this story no matter how big their part conveys a message. It is to this that I would like to further examine the Three Ruffians that while they portray villains, they represent symbols of a cautionary quality. The three ruffians represent ignorance, prejudice, and greed. They are the forces of evil that continually attempt to undo and defeat the forces of good. Once we realize what each of these groups of characters represent, then we are more able to contemplate their effects on the human condition and us.

To those who trace our symbolism to ancient solar worship, they represent the three winter months that plot to destroy the beauty and glory of summer. To those of us who find comfort in the origin of Freemasonry coming from the Ancient Mysteries of Egypt, it is the drama of Typhon, that evil spirit of evil who slayed Osiris, who then is resurrected. Many of us find satisfaction of this drama in the life and death of Jesus, who was crucified outside the gates of Jerusalem by three Ruffians, the Priest, the Pontius Pilate, and the mob. We know them by Jubela, Jubela, and Jublum," the three ruffians, brother and men of Tyre. Pike in his Book of the Words and Their Hidden Meanings (1992) investigates the names of the three Ruffians. Here he considers the meanings of the names Jubela, Jubelo and Jubelum as well as the origins of Abiram, Akirop and Abibal. The most current common names, utilizing their Hebrew equivalents, can be split into Yu-bal and a,o,um. He defines these as "Yu (yod)" Which in Hebrew means "Deity", "bel" meaning the god Baal and the signifier of a, o or um (Pike, 1992, p. 85). Newton mentions that Albert Pike identified the three Ruffians that are the greatest enemy to of individual welfare and social progress are Kingcraft, Priest craft, and ignorant mob-mind (we only need look at the present day at mob mentality at its worst in the United States and globally. The first strikes with a 24-inch gauge a blow to the throat, the seat of freedom of speech, thereby silencing it. This wound is fatal. The second stabs at the heart with a square, the home of freedom of conscience. This wound is also fatal since it puts out the last rays of Divine Light- how man is guided. The third using a setting maul murders Hiram Abiff with a blow to the brain which is the throne of freedom of thought

### The Three Ruffians

The first ruffian represents ignorance. Ignorance in this context is the lack of knowledge of how to properly relate to and act toward others or how to consider the welfare of others. Ignorance can allow a person to be led easily or influenced to commit offences that harm other people. These offences can take the form of plotting against someone, spreading rumors, lying, or other conduct that is detrimental to others or that may benefit the perpetrator at someone else's expense. Ignorance stifles the mental growth of a human being and helps prevent his ability to think beyond self. It also tends to foster an inflated sense of self entitlement which tends to encourage the type of behavior that ignorance proliferates.

The second ruffian represents prejudice. Prejudice creates and encourages hate and intolerance. The practice of intolerance makes a person or group reject the opinion or belief of others summarily, without giving any thought as to their legitimacy or worth. Prejudice becomes that narrow mindedness that encourages hate because of race, religion, and political beliefs, or some other reason that is unreasonable or invalid. It discourages a person from understanding his or her differences with others and hinders the growth and strength that understanding, and acceptance can produce.

The third ruffian represents greed. Greed is the desire to obtain wealth or power by any means necessary. Greed can manifest itself through thievery, deception, swindling, or any other means which can result in one person or group attaining an unfair advantage over another.

In contrast, the three principle fellowcrafts together represent the attainment of knowledge and the individual's effort to improve by practicing the Masonic tenets of brotherly love, relief, truth, and morality. They exemplify the effort to battle the three ruffians in defense of good. They teach us to battle ignorance by gaining knowledge of how to properly treat and relate to others. They demonstrate that this is a lifelong effort to improve our ability to practice the knowledge we gain. Through the Allegory, they instruct us to battle prejudice by the realization that every person should be treated equally without regard to their race, religious or political belief, wealth, or station in life. They teach us to battle greed by realizing that there are things in life that should be more valuable to us than worldly possessions and that honor, integrity, and honesty are invaluable in the mêlée against evil.

The three ruffians demonstrate that the forces of evil are always at work so that evil can triumph over good, and chaos can then rule. They use powerful weapons and allurements to influence and win people to their side, and they are always present to capture anyone

who might slip. The three fellowcrafts demonstrate that although the forces of evil are powerful and relentless, we can still prevail through perseverance and the diligent practice of virtue.

The last event in this part of our degree is when the individual receives the last secret of a Master Mason, representing the rebirth of the individual into a life where he is to work through the study, contemplation, and practice of these principles and virtues to continually improve.

Honor, integrity, reputation, and respect are the benefit for the individual when he takes these lessons to heart and practices them in his daily life. The Master Mason practicing these virtues in his daily life will influence others to seek association with us to improve themselves.

Manly Hall in his work, The Secret Teachings of All Ages echoes Pike's summation of the symbolism of the Ruffians and adds a few points of his own regarding the significance within the Hiramic Legend and allegories within. Hall states that the three Ruffians represent the laws of the inferior world; birth, and decay which always tend to undermine the plans of the Great Architect of the Universe. In his work The Lost Keys of Freemasonry Hall suggests that the three Ruffians are symbolic of "the three expressions of our lower self which are the murders of the goodness in each of us. One of the tools that Freemasonry provides brethren to make each of us a better version of ourselves today over yesterday is through this wonderful system of morality, veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols. Whether the symbolism of the three Ruffians is an interpretation on how society behaves, a mystical tale of the turning of the seasons or that internal battles each of us undergo on a daily journey is up to each of us to consider and decide for ourselves. What is important is that the roles these Ruffians portray should not be ignored or minimalized, but rather be looked upon as gigantic steppingstones to be observed along the path of our own individual masonic journey.


