Alarm Letter, 1775
Daniel Tyler, Jr. (1750-1832), copyist
Brooklyn, Connecticut

Just before dawn on April 19, 1775, John Parker and around 80 local militiamen gathered on the town common in Lexington, Massachusetts, as approximately 700 British soldiers approached from the direction of Boston, where they had left during the night of April 18. Realizing that they were vastly outnumbered, Parker ordered his men to disperse. Amid the confusion, a shot rang out. It has never been clear who fired first, but by the time the firing was over, eight Lexington men were killed and nine wounded. The British troops then left Lexington and marched on toward Concord where they intended to seize munitions that were stored there. The alarm - news of the skirmish on the Lexington Common – was spread quickly. By the time the British reached the Old North Bridge in Concord, they were met by 3,500 militiamen.

Beyond the Boston area, news of the deaths in Lexington spread through a series of letters copied and distributed along a planned network of Committees of Correspondence. By April 1775, this network was already organized throughout the colonies, ensuring that an infrastructure was in place to facilitate the efficient spread of important news across a large geographic area.

Joseph Palmer, a member of the Massachusetts Committee of Safety, sent the first urgent letter from Watertown by messenger Israel Bissell in the late morning of April 19, 1775. Bissell rode on horseback to Worcester, Massachusetts and then on to Brooklyn, Connecticut, where Daniel Tyler,





Jr. copied It on the morning of April 20, 1775. This copy was addressed on the reverse side of the letter "To Christopher Leffingwell Esq. Or Either the Committee of Correspondence - Norwich." Palmer's letter was copied several times in various Connecticut towns before reaching New York City on the afternoon of April 23.


The copyist, Daniel Tyler, Jr., graduated from Harvard in 1771 and, that same year, married Mehitable Putnam, daughter of General Israel Putnam. A brief biography on Tyler in *Sibley's Harvard Graduates* recounts Tyler copying out this alarm letter, noting that he "dashed off a copy of the Worcester message for the next Committee of Correspondence [i.e. the one at Norwich]," before heading to Boston with his father-in-law. He served as Putnam's adjutant during the Battle of Bunker Hill on June 17, 1775, and for the rest of the Siege of Boston, which ended on March 17, 1776

Watertown Wednesday Morning near 10 o'Clock

To all the Friends of American Liberty, be it known that this Morning before breake of Day a Brigade consisting of about 1000 or 1200 Men landed at Phip's Farm at Cambridge & marched to Lexington where they found a Company of our Colony Militia in Arms, upon Whom they fired without any Provocation and killed 6 Men and Wounded 4 others. By an Express from Boston this Moment, we find another Brigade are now upon their march from Boston supposed to be about 1000. The Bearer Mr. Israel Bissel is charged to alarm the County quite to Connecticut and all Persons are desired to furnish him with Fresh Horses as they may be needed. I have spoken with Several Persons who have seen the Dead & Wounded. Pray let the Delegates from this Colony to Connecticut see this they know.
